helped out on the day. The stall was a great success.

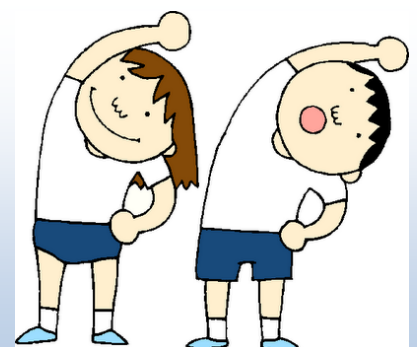
