It has been a very busy few weeks for many LPS students participating in a range of music and dance activities. Five students attended Creative Arts Camp at Lennox Head for all of week five. These students worked hard in either band, dance or vocal ensembles to prepare for an amazing concert for their parents on the Friday afternoon.

The Lismore Performing Arts Festival at the Workers Club last week provided opportunities for many LPS students to perform on stage for large audiences on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights as well as the matinee concert on Thursday. The support of staff and parents to co-ordinate and enable our school to be involved and prepare quality performances is sincerely appreciated. A very special 'Thank you' must be made to the school office staff for all of the extra work they had to do to make this possible for our students – booking buses, collecting notes and money, answering numerous questions (from all directions), organising student medications and many more tasks to ensure student welfare and inclusion.



The LPAF Concert Band included twelve students from LPS. This band performed Tuesday and Wednesday nights as well as at the matinee on Thursday. Andrew Hills tutors these students on flute, clarinet and saxophone in small group lessons and then rehearsals are held with the school band and combined band to prepare for the festival concerts. These students have been working hard to prepare their choir songs for future events and are to be commended on their increased effort over the past few weeks. The LPAF choir has rehearsed at LPS for 9 weeks to prepare items especially for the Performing Arts Festival. These students were recommended by their teachers and are to be commended on their singing ability

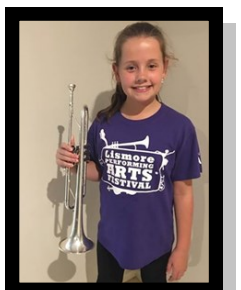

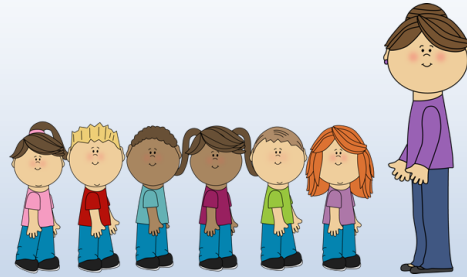
